Dear Professor Hinrichs,

Since 2016 the University and State Library of Münster has hosted the Fachinformationsdienst Benelux / Low Countries Studies (Specialised Information Service Benelux / Low Countries Studies; for short: FID Benelux) as part of the Specialised Information Services Programme funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG).

The multidisciplinary oriented *FID Benelux*, www.fid-benelux.de, is designed as a onestop provider of scientifically relevant literature and information about the culture and society of the Benelux countries and research support services. The mission of the project is to combine a comprehensive range of scientific literature, information and advisory services with electronic value-added services that are closely geared to the needs of academic research. The project aims to provide services that take into account both existing and future research interests and that are able to respond flexibly and in a demand-driven way to current research questions.

FID Benelux is addressed to a scientific community in the humanities and social sciences for which research data such as language and text-based collections, lexical resources and editions are of great relevance. Furthermore, *FID Benelux* is happy to contribute data to planned *Text+* projects, such as

the curated index of editions, or to otherwise become involved in the *Text+* network. Collaborating and exchanging data with partners within and outside the FID system has always been a given for us.
